

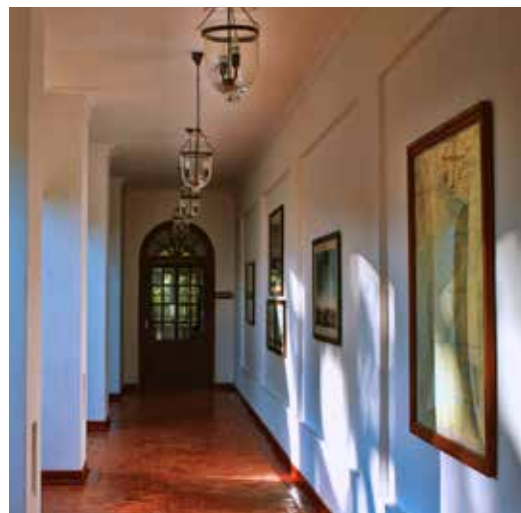

The land on which the historical Brunton & Sons Boatyard once stood, is now home to a new boutique hotel, which is an amalgamation of the history of Fort Kochi. They transformed what used to be a bustling, noisy boatyard into a truly unique hotel. Here, the flavours of Fort Kochi blend harmoniously with the echoes of the now long forgotten but ever-present influences of the Portuguese, Dutch and the British.



SAIL THROUGH HISTORY

The atmosphere of Brunton Boatyard reflects the historical past of Fort Kochi. Even the raintrees in the green courtyard were planted by the British. The lounge is reminiscent of the days of the Raj, with its high lofty ceiling and old-fashioned ‘punkhas’ of Rudyard Kipling’s memories. The field sloping roofs and terracotta tiled flooring are all relics of a forgotten style of gracious, spacious architecture. The large, comfortable armchairs, the deceptively delicate cane chairs, the wrought iron sofas and divans, the antique solid spice chests made of mahogany and teak, bound with brass, and many other artifacts will catch your eye.









SHIPSHAPE STATEROOMS

Our rooms and suites offer a magnificent view of the sea and the delta, as Brunton Boatyard is located at the mouth of the Arabian Sea. While some overlook the bustling streets of Fort Kochi, lined with heritage buildings. The view of the sea gives you a glimpse of life at the harbour, where you can see quaint fishing boats and brightly coloured country craft, motor boats that ply between the jetties of Fort Kochi and the small islands that dot the sea just around Kochi. And if you are really lucky, a school of dolphins.







PLATING THE PAST

Spend an afternoon gazing at the sea and watching the ships glide by, as you dine on our promenade. At History Restaurant, you can enjoy different kinds of cuisines from various communities like the Dutch, Arab, Portuguese, British, Indian and the Jews, who settled in Cochin. The culture and cuisine of these communities was influenced by the native Keralites and vice versa, thus producing an entirely new flavour in the kitchens of Kerala. Our chefs offer you an eclectic menu from this melting pot of cultures at the History Restaurant.





A TASTE OF HISTORY

The Terrace Grill overlooks the bustling jetty and serves you fresh seafood, grilled and served the way you like it. Though it is only open for dinner, their catch-of-the-day is not to be missed. Being an open-air restaurant, service here is restricted during the monsoon season.

The Armoury Restaurant, the cocktail lounge and restaurant gets its name from the replica antique weapons displayed on its walls. It's open for breakfast, lunch and dinner and serves Kerala and international cuisine. You must try the Cardamom Spiced Ganache or the seafood meals here.







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AT YOUR SERVICE

Enjoy traditional Kerala cooking demos in an interactive session with the chef and enter the magical world of Indian spices. Indulge in various healing Ayurveda services at 'Aryatheeram'. At sunset, you can take a cruise around the Cochin Harbour, organized by Brunton Boatyard and departing from our private jetty. Unwind and relax by the pool. Or explore Fort Kochi in the heritage walking tours organized by the hotel.





WALKING THROUGH HISTORY

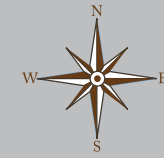
Stroll down to Mattancherry Spice Market where you can catch a glimpse of spices being dried, sorted and packed, as spice merchants try to get a bargain. Or take a walk along the beach to watch the Chinese Fishing Nets that were erected in 1350-1450 AD, being lowered into the sea.

The architecture and cuisine of Fort Kochi showcase a 650-year-old legacy with Dutch, Portuguese and Jewish influences that thrive in beautiful harmony with the local Malabar heritage. These magnificent landmarks and monuments reflect the rich, glorious past of Kochi.
